Sixteenth Latin Summer School 18 - 22 January 2009

The very successful five-day Summer School was attended by 230 students covering a wide range of ages and abilities with a number coming from regional N.S.W., and interstate. There were 24 tutors (schoolteachers, university lecturers, and postgraduate students) who taught at four different levels from beginners to postgraduates. Guest lecturers included Em Prof. Edwin Judge, Andrew Miles, Kathryn Welch, Anne Rogerson, Robert Forgas, Kathleen Riley, Martin Stone and John Coombs. A detailed report and financial statement of the Latin Summer School will be tabled at the AGM.

Membership

There are currently 150 members of the Classical Association, including two societies and one honorary life member (Miss Beryl Ferris). With deep regret we report the death of two members : Michael Naughtin, a long-serving Marist Brother at St. Joseph's College whom we honoured with Hon. Life membership in 2002 and Ian Craigie who taught Greek at St Ignatius College.

Classicum

As usual two editions of the CA/CLTA Journal *Classicum* were produced during 2009 and we express our gratitude to the Editor, Dr Ian Plant, the Reviews Editor, Dr Trevor Evans and the Business Manager, Miss Frances Muecke, for their work on this excellent publication. A full report on *Classicum* will be presented at the AGM. During the year the Editor negotiated CA membership of CAL (Copyright Agency Limited), an Australian rights management company which collects and distributes copyright funds. This will bring our journal to a much wider audience and attract funding for CA.
